ADVENT/CHRISTMAS

Advent is the period preceding the Christmas season. It begins on the Sunday nearest November 30, and covers four Sundays. Because Advent precedes Christmas Day by four Sundays, the day it begins changes from year to year. This year, 2015, Advent begins on November 29.

The word advent comes from Latin and means 'the coming'. For centuries, Advent has been a time of spiritual reflection as well as cheer and anticipation. Even as the Christmas season has become more secular with the commercial world urging holiday shoppers to buy more and more through aggressive advertising, Advent still brings joy and meaning to Christians particularly in the liturgical community. Many Christian families find quiet moments lighting candles on their Advent wreaths, and children use Advent calendars to count the days until Christmas.

Advent has probably been observed since the fourth century. Originally, it was a time when converts to Christianity prepared themselves for baptism on the Feast of the Epiphany of our Lord.

During the Middle Ages, Advent became associated with preparation for the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus. Many Christians still view Advent as a season to prepare for the Second Coming of Jesus. In the last fifty years, however, it has also come to be thought of as a time of anticipating the Nativity, the Coming of our Lord Jesus on Christmas Day.

One of the symbols of Advent is the Advent wreath. An advent wreath traditionally is made with evergreen in the shape of a circle. The circle symbolizes the Eternity of God. Like the circle, God's eternal mercy has no beginning and no end. God is

eternal. The green speaks of the hope that Christians have in God, the hope of newness, of renewal and of eternal life. The wreath contains four candles, three purple and one rose. Purple dyes were once so rare and costly that they were associated with royalty. In liturgical Churches this color is used to symbolize the royalty of Jesus. The color purple is now replaced by the color blue in many liturgical churches. Advent with its focus on Anticipation and Waiting communicates the message of Hope. Blue, the color of the sky, communicates that powerful message of hope. The Christ who came in history assuming our flesh, who continues to come to us in Word and Sacrament, will come again from that same blue sky from which he ascended into heaven. Royal Blue is also used to symbolize the royalty of Jesus. The three purple or blue candles on the Advent wreath symbolize hope, peace, and love. These candles, are lit on the first, second, and fourth Sundays of Advent. The rose candle, which symbolizes joy, is lit on the third Sunday. A fifth candle is placed inside the Advent wreath and is usually called the 'Christ candle'. This candle is lit on Christmas Day. It is white, the color of purity and completeness and it symbolizes that thorough our Lord Jesus 'though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow'. During the four Sundays of Advent therefore, we prayerfully anticipate and prepare for the divine gifts of peace, hope, joy and love that comes to the world from God the Father in and through the nativity - the birth of the Savior, Jesus Christ.

This period of anticipation and preparation leads into the joyful celebration of that which we have anticipated and prepared for, namely, God's gift of a Savior – Jesus the Christ, Emmanuel (God with us), the Prince of Peace, the Savior of the world. Christmas is not just about glitter and lights, drinking and feasting, sharing gifts, Christmas trees, Santa Claus with his reindeers and all or any of the other festive things associated with the season. Oh, yes, there is a place for the festivities. The sad fact is that many, too many, folks inside and outside of the Church, attend the party but have no sense of what the feasting and celebration is all about. Let us use this Advent season to walk together as the people of God, through this period of anticipation and preparation, so that come Christmas, we will not only know what the party is about, but we will also have a celebration filled

What's missing?

When shopping for gifts became too difficult, an elderly man decided to just send checks to relatives. In his Christmas cards, mailed early he wrote, "Buy your own present!"

After the holiday, the man noticed he'd received few cards in return. Puzzled, he went into his study intending to write to a few relatives and ask what had happened. As he cleared his cluttered desk, the horrified man four

cleared his cluttered desk, the horrified man found the answer. Under a stack of papers were the checks he'd forgotten to enclose with his cards!

The lesson? Don't be in such a hurry to give gifts that you inadvertently leave out what's most important. Without the message of Jesus and his birth, the earthly trappings of Christmas are empty indeed.



Taking several trains on vacation, I noticed how the conductors' "welcome" messages differed. Unlike air travel with identical safety instructions no matter the airline or flight attendant, on Amtrak each speech was unique. One conductor emphasized that parents should always accompany their

children. Another warned that restrooms would be shut down if they weren't kept clean. Still another said passengers entering the station during a brief stop risked getting left behind.

No doubt each announcer highlighted matters that had previously been problematic. Similarly, the gospel accounts of Jesus' birth emphasize what each writer thought most important to share.

Matthew, writing for a Jewish audience, highlights similarities between Jesus and Moses; focuses on Joseph, whose lineage connects Jesus to King David and Abraham; and tells of wise men seeking the new "king of the Jews." Luke, meanwhile, writes to Gentiles and society's "underdogs" women and the poor, highlighting Mary, Jesus' humble birth and his first visitors; lowly shepherds.

We, too, might consider how to tailor faith-sharing to our listeners. Long-term friends, new neighbors children and the hurting will be moved by different aspects of God's love.




