FROM THE PASTOR

ORDINARY TIME

Once we get past the Feast of Pentecost, the Church enters into the Sundays after Pentecost. This period of the Liturgical calendar is usually referred to as 'Ordinary Time'. This title could be very misleading as it may reasonably be interpreted to suggest that these Sundays are 'ordinary' and as such not really important. Such a conclusion could not be further from the truth. The time between The Feast of Pentecost and the First Sunday in Advent is a very important time of the liturgical cycle in the life of the people of God.

This part of our Liturgical Cycle is called 'ordinary' because the Sundays are numbered. The Latin word "ordinalis" from which we get the English word 'ordinary' simply refers to numbers in a series. So, the Sundays numbered 1st Sunday, 2nd Sunday, 3rd Sunday, etc. after Pentecost or Epiphany, were called the numbered Sundays, or the Sundays in 'Ordinary Time'. Further, the Latin word, "ordinalis" is derived from the root Latin word "ordo" from which we get the English word "order". So, "Ordinary Time", far from being unimportant, is in fact the time of 'Order' or more explicitly the orderly life of the Church. During this time of the Church year we are not feasting and celebrating as the church does during the major Festivals such as Christmas and Easter nor are we engaged in more focus penance like we do during the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent. This is the time when we focus on life together in watchfulness and expectation of the second Advent/Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore it is a very important time in the life of the Church.

The focus of this period of time in the Church year therefore, is centered on the biblical truth that we, the 'called out' people of God, are a people in watchful expectation of the second coming of our Lord. As such from 1st Sunday after Pentecost until the first Sunday in Advent, the Church is focused on discerning what it means for us, as the people of

God, to be a people in watchful expectation of the second coming of Jesus. This focus, broadly speaking, takes us into two directions: (a) How do we live together as the people of God. This is usually referred to as our Ministry. (b) How we reach beyond our gathered community with the Gospel. This is usually referred to as our Mission.

Our Ministry - how we relate with and take care of each other - will greatly influence the effectiveness of our Mission - the way we reach out to others with the Gospel. This period of the Church year gives us the opportunity to pause and reflect on our Ministry and how that Ministry informs and enables our Mission. We believe and teach that our Ministry is one of Word and Sacraments. As such the very essence of our gathering together as the people of God is deeply grounded in the Word of God and nourished by the Sacraments. So, Sunday after Sunday we gather around the Word of God and the Sacraments to receive the gift of God's grace. Through the Word and Sacraments God pours out His forgiveness and gives us life and Salvation. Therefore our relationship with each other reflects that grace which we have received. Saint Paul puts it very beautifully in **Ephesians 14:30---5:2** *"4³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. ³¹ Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. ³² Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. ⁵ ¹ Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. ² And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."*

When our life together is grounded in the Word of God and nourished by the Sacraments, we do not grieve the Holy Spirit. Rather, the Holy Spirit works among us and we grow each day in a loving, forgiving, healing community that becomes attractive. We become God's alternative community to a troubled hateful, selfish world. So, throughout this season of "Ordinary Time" let us strive to live in the Word so that we do not grieve the Holy Spirit, but rather experience the joy of the Lord. As we grow in grace, God will lead others to us so that they too may experience that grace which we manifest in our lives so that they too may experience the joy of the Lord. In so doing our Ministry will be joyful and our Mission fruitful.

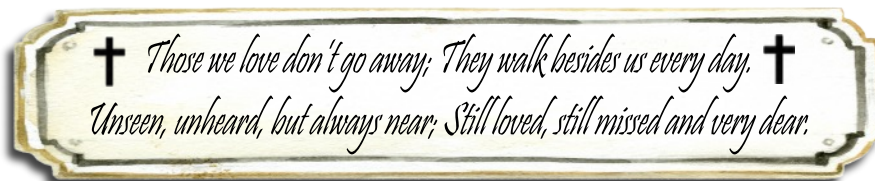

Luis and a Lamb

Luis received a shoebox in Panama at age 6.

The stuffed lamb in my shoebox was the first toy I ever received. I still have it. It was really a treasure.

It played a little song and was so beautiful. It was so tender, so soft. The little face of the lamb was something I loved. I used to pretend I was playing with a real lamb. After I finished playing with it, I always put it back inside my plastic shoebox. The lamb made me smile every time I saw it because I would remember the day people gave me the shoebox.

The most valuable items in my shoebox were school supplies: crayons, a pencil sharpener, pens, pencils, and notebooks. In Panama in 1996, if you didn't have supplies, you could not go to school. That year I was able to use the pens, the pencils, the notebooks—everything.

The day before I received my shoebox I was begging my mom to buy supplies so I could go to school. She said, "I can't. I don't have the money but if you want you can pray."

We never went to church. We never talked about God, but that day she told me to pray. I asked her to teach me how. She said, "You can talk to God like He's right in front of you, but you have to respect Him because He is the Lord."

"Inside the shoebox was a letter that said, 'Jesus loves you and I love you, too.'" So I knelt and I talked to Him like He was in front of me. I asked specifically for school supplies and the next day I was invited to a church for a special event. That's where I got my shoebox.

Inside the shoebox was a letter that said, "Jesus loves you and I love you, too." That message broke my heart immediately. All that I needed was to know that I'm loved. So to receive that letter allowed me to see the spiritual message behind the box.

We were nonbelievers and the shoebox helped us understand that God answers prayers. My mom said, "Now I know that God is real." Because someone took a moment to write down "Jesus loves you and I do too," it allowed me to see that even though I didn't have a father and even though I don't have a perfect life, He's there for me. I lived in the ghetto. We didn't have anything. I was hopeless. The shoebox allowed me to understand that God cared for me.

My mother and my little sister became Christians right after I received my shoebox, but I didn't understand that I needed to follow Christ. Still the letter in the shoebox was always telling me, "He loves you. He's there for you. He's waiting for you." There were people telling me all the time that God had a better plan for my life. At 14, I realized that I needed Him and accepted Jesus as my Savior.

The shoebox was the first seed that was planted in my life. Today I don't have the pencils but I have something that is more important because the Bible says, "the word of the Lord remains forever" (1 Peter 1:25, ESV). I just needed to know that He loved me, so the shoebox was a beautiful gift.



What to Pack:



"Wow" Item

Delight a kid! Start with a medium to large item that will capture the child's attention the instant he or she opens the box.

Ideas include: Soccer ball with pump, Stuffed animal, Toys (puppets, trucks, etc.), Doll (baby, Barbie, etc.), Musical instrument, Outfit, Shoes

Other Suggestions

Toys: Include items that children will immediately embrace such as toy cars, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Non-liquid Hygiene Items: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.

Accessories: T-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

Crafts: Make your own items such as hair bows, finger puppets, and friendship bracelets. Download instructions here.

Age and Gender-Specific Ideas: Girls 2-4, Girls 5-9, Girls 10-14, Boys 2-4, Boys 5-9, Boys 10-14.

A Personal Note: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.

WHY WE SHOULDN'T GIVE UP ON THE CHURCH

The Church is a messy place by nature. That's what happens when a bunch of sinners come together anywhere. But it is a messy place designed by God to be His face to the World, and all those sinners reflect Him in unique ways.

Nothing reflects God to the world like the Church does. No, we don't "do" church 100 percent correctly and we never will. No, church is not a perfect place. Yes, church displays the sins of all its people very publicly. But none of that changes what it is or can be.

To leave the Church is to hurt yourself and to hurt others. I don't mean like a slap in the face (though in some cases it's a bit like that). I mean hurt like malnourishment.

We are created by God to connect with others and, in that connection, reveal more of Him to each other and to the world. When we depart we deprive ourselves of those aspects of God others reflect and we deprive them of those aspects we reflect. Leaving is starving our souls and others'.

Solitude is wonderful. But many things in life, maybe most things, are better enjoyed with others, including God. That's why we're called to worship with others to study with others, to pray with others. And church is the outlet for that, an imperfect outlet, but the outlet nonetheless.

We were created by God to connect with others and, in that connection, reveal more of Him to each other and to the world.

God wants us to experience Him to the fullest and that is done with others in song, in study, in reflection, in prayer, in tears, in confession, in celebration---with others, doing church.

It's inevitable that we will leave particular churches at different points in our life, but leaving the Church altogether is escapism. You may find some stresses relieved and conflicts avoided. Often, I often want to slap the stupid out of the church. It can be such a maddening collection of people. (And I suspect I contribute to the stupid that needs slapping just as often.) But none of that changes what it is: the organism of God's presence and Kingdom in the world. It is His means of connecting people to the Gospel, to hope, to life.

No matter your frustrations and hurts, it cannot be abandoned. You need it now whether you know it or not, and someday you will have a need nothing and one else can meet. And the Church will be where Jesus shows Himself to you.

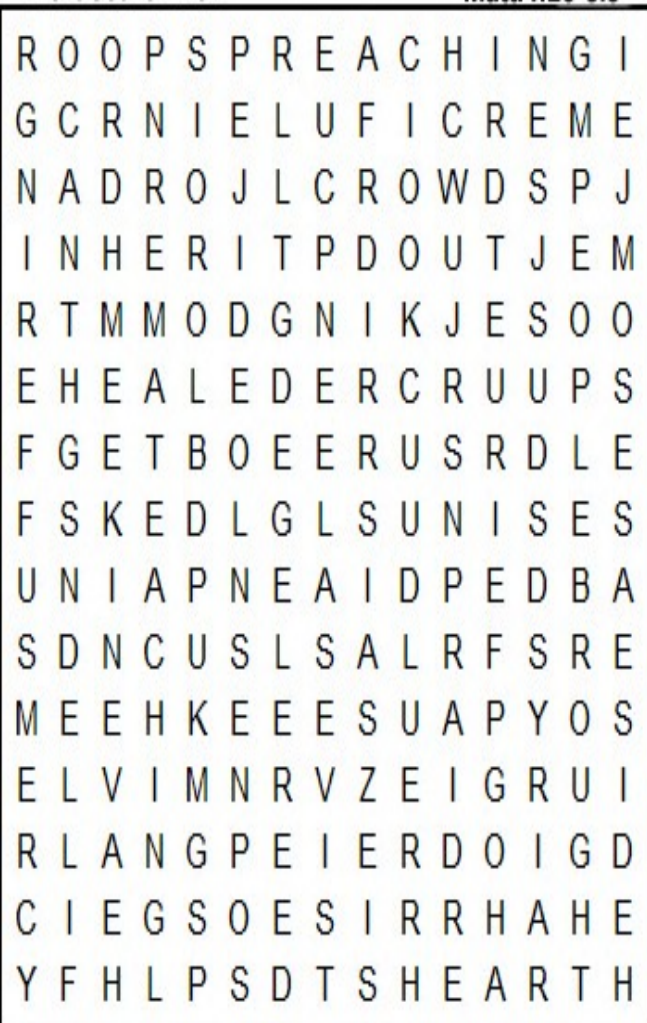
