THE STORY OF THANKSGIVING

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For many, Thanksgiving Day dates back to the Pilgrims and Indians. But for us as Christians, the deepest roots of our thanksgiving goes back long before the Pilgrims. "Thanksgiving" goes back all the way to the Genesis story of creation. It's a story that keeps going through the ages and right on into the present. It's a story that gives meaning to our lives. We could call it the true story of thanksgiving — or we could call it the Christian gospel viewed through the lens of that often undervalued virtue known as "gratitude." It's a theme that runs through the entire bible. So, let's take a look at the Christian story of thanksgiving.

First, the bible is clear that God created humanity for gratitude. We exist to appreciate God. He created us to honor him by giving him thanks. Appreciating God as our creator, and his work of redemption through Christ, is fundamental to living a Christian life.

In describing what's gone wrong with the world, Saint Paul said this: "Although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened."

Romans 1:21

Part of what the first man and woman were created to do, was honor God by being thankful. And part of what we exist to do is to honor God by being thankful to Him. Numerous biblical passages attest to this divine truth. Humanity was created to appreciate God and to give Him thanks. But as we've already seen from Romans 1:21, ingratitude wasn't far away.

Second, we all have failed miserably in appreciating and giving thanks to God as we should. Humanity keeps reliving the Garden of Eden story. Satan, in his essence, is an ingrate. Satan wanted more: more power, more glory. At the heart of the story of the fall, is the revelation that Satan has sunk his venom of ingratitude to humanity. Satan's sin becomes the first sin of all humanity: the sin of ingratitude. Adam and Eve are, simply, painfully ungrateful for what God gave. Isn't that the catalyst of all our sin?

Our fall was, has always been, and always will be, that we aren't satisfied in God and what God gives. We hunger for something more, something other. Satan the ingrate spawns unthankfulness in Adam and Eve, who pass it along to all of us. Both before our conversion and after, we are unthankful people. This is so painfully true.

And we not only fail to be thankful like we ought, but we also fail to get the balance right between physical and spiritual. In our sin, we fail again and again to get the proportions right. Only with divine redemption are we able to grow toward a balance that goes something like this: Christians are thankful for all God's gifts, especially his eternal gifts, and especially the surpassing value of knowing his Son. "Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ." Philippians 3:8

Third, God himself, in the person of his Son, Jesus, entered into our thankless world, lived in flawless appreciation of his Father, and died on our behalf for our chronic ingratitude. It is Jesus, the God-man, who has manifested the perfect life of thankfulness. The texts where Jesus gives his Father thanks, is quite an impressive list. Some examples for you to look up are: *Matthew 11:25; Luke 10:21; John 11:41; Matthew 15:36; Mark 8:6; John 6:11; John 6:23* to mention a few. Also, it is important to remember when our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist (Thanksgiving), "He took bread and when He had *given thanks*,

He broke it...", also, "He took a cup, and when He had *given thanks* He said....
"Jesus is not only God himself but also the perfect thankful human. Jesus, the God-man, not only died to forgive our failures in giving God the thanks He's due, but He also lived the perfect life of appreciation and thankfulness, on our behalf, toward His Father.

Finally, by faith in Jesus, we are redeemed from ingratitude and it's just eternal penalty in hell, and freed to enjoy the pleasure of being doubly thankful for God's favor toward us — not only as his creatures, but also as his redeemed.

It is fitting for us as redeemed ingrates to strive to live a life in an ongoing posture of gratitude toward our Redeemer. The kind of life that flows from the amazing grace of God through Jesus, is a life that is lived in continual thankfulness to God. This is the kind of life in which the Christian is being continually renewed, and grows each day to be more like Jesus.

And so, the apostle Paul encourages Christians in his letter to the Colossians to have lives characterized by thanksgiving. "May you be "strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy, giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light." Colossians 1:11-12

"....as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving." Colossians 2:6-7

"And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And *be thankful*. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, *with thankfulness in your hearts to God*. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, *giving thanks* to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:15-17

Only in Jesus, are we able to become the kind of persistently thankful people God created us to be, and, to fulfill our human destiny of thanksgiving. For the Christian, with both feet standing firmly in the good news of Jesus, there are possibilities for a true thanksgiving which we otherwise would never know.



A call for Queens residents to volunteer to help those in need

Three years later, Dushime and his family moved to Buffalo, New York through a refugee resettlement program.

"This showed me that God can use anything and anywhere to bring hope where all hope is lost." Dushime said in a video, "These shoeboxes that you pack not only can they change individual lives but they can also change entire communities like I have seen in my life."

Samaritan's Purse established Operation Christmas Child in 1993 and has collected and delivered more than 168 million gift shoeboxes to children in more than 160 countries and territories around the world. The project's mission is to "demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need" and spread the message of Christianity.

"Many of these children have never received a gift before in their lives." says Regional Area Coordinator Danielle McCarty. "We wanted to share through firsthand accounts how these simple messages of love and hope are delivered and the life-changing impact they A project run by an international Christian organization wants Queens residents to take a worldwide trip with a shoebox ahead of the holiday season.

On Friday, Oct. 4, 2019 Operation Christmas Child called on locals to pack shoeboxes of school supplies, hygiene items and toys for children around the world. According to Samartian's Purse, the organization that runs the project, this year's goal is to pack enough boxes for 12,000 children in need.

Participants went to Queens Herald Church in Fresh Meadows to experience the shoebox's journey from packing to its worldwide impact.

The Incredible Journey of a Shoebox even features firsthand accounts of gift distributions in Tanzania. Including the story of Yves Dushime, who found comfort in his shoebox at age 11 after fleeing the ripple effects of the Rwandan genocide.

Dushime recalls receiving a warm scarf, an item he saw as a promise from God that he and his family would escape life as refugees. "How shall I be a good steward for the Lord, for all the good things God has done for me?"
