# "Faith in Action"

<sup>24</sup> By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, <sup>25</sup> choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. <sup>26</sup> He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward.

### Dear Brothers and Sisters:

As we return from our July/August break I invite you to join with me in an exploration of our faith journey as the people of God. Those of us who are members of the Christian tradition are, for the most part, rightly referred to as 'people of faith'. Therefore, it is necessary for us to wrestle with what this 'title' implies. Generally, for a Lutheran Christian, a 'person of faith' is someone who is baptized and confirmed and is therefore a member of the church. Some would add that the person will have to regularly attend Services, receive the Lord's Supper frequently and participate fully in the activities of the church in order to rightly wear the title of 'a person of faith'. However, this definition is only partially true. One can do all these things and still not truly be 'a person of faith'.

Being a 'person of faith' is basically about the life we live every day in and out of church. A life of faith is about a life lived in a loving, thankful, relationship with God. This means that we have to, be guided by the Holy Spirit, strive to be open to God's desire to enable our relationship with Him to grow from strength to strength. This relationship building begins with saturating our hearts and minds with the Word of God. The Word of God is the gift that God had given to us so that, among other important things, we can learn about His love for us. This Word

teaches us that God's love for us flows in and through His Son, Jesus. When we believe this and invite Jesus into our lives, Jesus dwells with us. Our relationship with God is through the Jesus who dwells in us. This relationship is strengthened and sustained by the work of the Holy Spirit that God pours out upon us.

Relationships, to a large extent, guides our thoughts and actions. A loving relationship with family and friends instinctively makes us think and act in their best interest. In like manner, a relationship with God, instinctively makes us want to think and act in a way that is pleasing to God. However, because we are not perfect, we often think and do things that are not in the best interest of family and friends, and that is not pleasing to God. When we do, we are usually instinctively aware that we have messed up. When this happens, as it often does, God understands our failings because He knows that we are 'broken', imperfect' and sinful and cannot help ourselves. So, God has provided the gift of repentance and forgiveness. It is a gift that God has given to us through the death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus. Our faith in our loving, forgiving God, moves us to repent and receive His forgiveness. We are then empowered to seek the forgiveness of those we have sinned against as well. This is what faithful living looks like, hence the title a 'person of faith'.

Moses had access to all the power and riches of Egypt. However, Moses realized that if he embraced the power and riches at his disposal, it would mean that he would have to harm God's people, his own new found family from whom he was separated. So, he acted in faith and gave it all up. Moses' relationship with God, did not allow for him to let power and riches come between Him and doing right by God. He chose to think and act in a manner that pleased God. As such, Moses demonstrated that he was a 'person of faith'. As we seek to live our lives as people of faith, the Devil is at work among us. The Devil dangles 'power and riches' as the greatest challenge in our quest to staying firm in our faith.

Every moment of our lives we are either being manipulated by the lure of power and riches or being tempted to lure others. Politicians do it in order to make us

want to elect them, the business community does it in order for us to buy what they are selling even though life was just fine without whatever it is they are selling. Credit Card companies entice us to acquire their credit cards and then inflict upon us exorbitant taxes and fees, the media sensationalizes their broadcasts to make us want to watch their stations so that they could get high ratings and thereby maximize their bottom line. The list can go on and on. These deliberate intentional acts are so ingeniously crafted that many have convinced themselves that these things are done on their behalf. It's amazing how we also do that to each other in practically every human relationship: husband and wives, parents and children, neighbor and neighbor, church member and church member, employer and employee, co-worker and co-worker find ways to exercise power and control over each other. Some are better at it than others. We just cannot help ourselves. It usually begins with our love for each other. At some point, that love crosses a line and it becomes manipulative and controlling.

In addition, the unbridled obsession of accumulating riches can shift our focus away from all the things that matter to us: the people we love; the values we cherish, the faith we embrace. Before we know it, we have no values, no faith and the ones we once loved is grossly neglected.

We can become so entrenched in an obsession with power and riches that we learn how to justify our actions. It is very easy to be convinced that our inappropriate behavior is necessary for the benefit of our loved ones. Faith helps us to find the balance between providing for the needs of each other and becoming so obsessive that we lose our sense of what is reasonable. The sad thing is that we could get caught in this rut while still insisting that we have faith in God.

In conclusion, faith is not just about what we say we believe and what we confess in a creed. Faith is living out that belief and creed in our daily lives. Like Moses we have to refuse to be part of the power play of our world and learn to love God and neighbor. The Apostle James cautioned us with these words: <sup>26</sup> For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead. James 2:26.

Yes! We cannot just say we have faith. Our faith must translate into action. What we believe must be translated in the life that we live. The life we live is our faith in action.


